USE OF FLOWERS AND PLANTS

The plants and arrangements have the same robust, uncultivated appearance as the rest of the trend. This means that the raw bulb in bulb products can be displayed again. Ideas include: differently coloured layers of sand in a glass dish or vase with the bulb in. Bowls or dishes could be stacked with each slightly overhanging the one below, and with a variety of bulbs in the overhanging section, thus creating a striped stack. In this case, it is important to show the earth. Arrangements are not neat or clean.



This makes us feel as though we are connected with the roots of our culture. Different structures of materials are combined in order to ensure a rich contrast. The shapes used are naturally crude and are occasionally whimsical or even eroded. This helps to create a rugged and sometimes primeval space.
